




James W. Northrop Program (spring and fall):

Since 2019, our program has grown from one to three teachers. serving both English learners and special needs students each season. In 2023, over 30 students with diverse needs from SHS were integrated. The fall curriculum included English Writing, Technology in the Classroom and Literacy classes, that targeted basic skills for newcomer students. Cultural activities featured various local visits to entities. Importantly, our program provided a space for students to learn, grow, forge friendships, and foster hope for their future.



Level Up Academic Summer Program

This year, EKO partnered with the Summit YMCA, conducting a remediation program for 20 students within the Y's facility to mitigate weather impacts. Mornings focused on academic practice, followed by afternoons at the Springfield Swimming Pool for a unique summer camp experience provided by the Y. EKO continued to offer essential academic support, fostering cultural immersion, exposure to positive role models, friendship building, and ensuring the students' happiness. Additionally, breakfast comprising cereal and fruit was provided every morning.



Spring and Fall Into Art

A 5-week, hands-on art program for middle school lowincome students in partnership with the NJ Visual Arts Center. EKO assisted several students who attended this program with the application for scholarships to keep participating in art classes at NJVAC.

Spring and Fall Improv(ing) Students

An 8-week improv comedy class for Summit High School students in partnership with Vivid Stage at the Oakes Center in Summit.

Soccer Clinics

An initiative to teach fundamental soccer skills to students enrolled in the Level Up program. The clinic aimed to impart technical expertise and cultivate teamwork abilities, fostering an environment of enjoyment and camaraderie. The program was overseen and guided by young athletes from the Summit community.



ESL for Parents

A weekly, one-hour conversational English program on Saturday mornings at The Connection in Summit, New Jersey. The program offered childcare for families that needed it. On average, ten parents attended the program each week.

ESL for Young Adults

A Conversational English weekly class for students ages 16 to 21 at the Summit YMCA. This class provides much needed conversation time for English learners. Class focuses on everyday vocabulary.
